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


The problems associated with youth at risk, including the homeiess and disadvantaged was and remains our priority.


It is now time to remember and honour their legacy bringing together a signature event to the Northern Gold Coast. Timing around the Castrol Edge Gold Coast 600 and also the Gold Coast Marine Expo will ensure that there is an abundance of opportunities for local Gold Coasters and visitors alike, to experience an event that has the potential to rival anything else in the world.

It is with great pleasure that I introduce the eponymous 'Water Wings Wheels' Official magazine 'Elegance in Motion'.









Australian motor racing has been blessed with many great drivers including 2 world F1 champions. It is easy to look toward these famous sportsmen with vicarious pride and boast of "our" success as a racing nation. During the 1950's the likes of Jack Brabham emerged from the ashes of World War 2 to apply that, now fading, Australian inventiveness and mental toughness to produce such winning results. This was no chance occurrence. Jack was pushed by those parochial drivers of fame such as Bib Stillwell, Frank Gardner, Stan Jones and a whole host of iconic Australians who were household names and now are only remembered by fanatical racing fans.

Behind all of these illustrious gladiators were the real innovators and "Aussies" who produced results on a shoe string. Men like Warren Pitstock who made his own cars (including wheels). Harry Lefoe and Ron Grose. Cars like the WPII and the Nota Din. This brings us to the main character in our story "Ron Thorp" 4 who along with those and their cohorts

previously mentioned, literally wrought a sport from the relics of a previous motoring era with little or no funding.

I had the great pleasure of interviewing Ron during mid-winter in Tenterfield. He had graciously agreed to come to Tenterfield from Inverell and reduce our travelling time. I knew him immediately,

he had arrived in an immaculate 1952 Bristol 401. This seems typical of this quiet spoken knight from that dangerous era of the 50 and 60's where many died while racing. Safety was in its infancy and Ron's stories included having to install a seat belt, making the mandatory roof from a discarded Commer utility, racing with retread tyres and watching most of the Hotrod field fall by the way side in his first race with them and scoring a memorable and precious to him now "3rd place". He was only 18.

Ron regaled us with stories of his innate entrepreneurial ability and racing. As a young apprentice he started a small 2nd hand car sales business and built the business into one of the most successful in the Wollongong area. During this period he was able to go racing and graduate into more exotic machinery. From a 1932 Ford V8 special to the Masling Humber then a Aston Martin DB3S sports racer and most notable the first AC cobra to arrive on

Australian shores. This car is now in the hands of the Bowden family and appeared in the historic races at the Goodwood Revival Historic Car races in 2012. The new custodians invited Ron and he was able to mount the old charger once more.

The famous number 69 has been kept as it was when racing and still garners a smile from Ron when he reminisces.

1958 to 1960- Owned and drove a 1932 Ford Hot Rod at Hume Weir, Tarrawingee, Mount Panarama, Gnoo Blas, Warwick Farm and Windsor Speedway. Third place in the NSW Hot Rod Championship in





1960 to 1961 - Owned and drove a AER open wheeler otherwise known as the Masling Humber at Warwick Farm, Hume Weir, Tarrawingee, Catalina Park, Mount Panorama and Kembla Grange Speedway. Fifth place in the feature race for racing cars at Catalina Park opening meeting.

1961 to 1964- Owned and drove an Aston Martin DB3S sports car previously owned by Tom Sulman and part of the Kangaroo Team. Venus include Oran Park, Warwick Farm, Lowood, Mount Panorama, Longford and Catalina Park. First Place in Division 1 Sports Racing Car event at the open meeting of Oran Park in 1962.

1965 to 1972- Owned and drove the first AC Cobra to come to Australia in numerous hill climbs and circuit events. Hill climb venues include, Lakeland Park, Huntley, Silverdale, Mount Panorama,

Grafton and King Edward Park. Circuit venues include, Warwick farm, Mount Panorama, Surfers Gardens, Lakeside, Catalina Park, Caversham, Oran Park and Mallala. His major successes include 1965 Australian Hill Climb Championship, entering and winning 3 Classes while setting new class records in each. The 1965 Caversham 6 hour race finishing 2nd outright, 1966 1st outright, 1967 2nd outright. The Surfers Paradise 12 hour races of 1966 & 1967 9th outright, first in Production Sports Car Class on both occasions.

Ron has now accepted the responsibility as Patron of Water Wheels Wings and we welcome him into this new venture. Please make yourself known to Ron when you attend in October.

Recently, Richards has driven in the Targa Tasmania as well as numerous other tarmac rallies in the Australian Targa Championship and other tarmac rallies, driving for Porsche. Partnering Richards as navigator has been motor racing journalist and commentator Barry Oliver. The pairing of Richards and Oliver (affectionately known as Team Grandpa in later

years) has won the Targa Tasmania a record 8 times. Richards and Oliver made their debut in Targa in 1993 in a Porsche 968 CS.[2]

His final victory saw him become only the fourth winner of the event in a two wheel drive car, and is the last person to do so, holding off more fancied four wheel drive rivals over a wet day 5 to win his last Targa Tasmania title.

"No peer" to LANCIA

The famous Top Gear programme took a survey of the English automobile enthusiasts to find out which marque was the best. The Vote came down to FORD. I don't believe any real numbers nominated Lancia. In their inimitable way the Top Gear boys eschewed the public and proclaimed that there was no peer to LANCIA.

Firstly the definition of a "Marque" as stated in the Oxford dictionary is

"Early 20th century: from French, backformation from marquer 'to brand', of Scandinavian origin"

Aspiring automobile makers would like to be classified as a marque but there are several things that might distinguish a "Marque". The things that determine that ethereal

"puro sanaue" thoroughbred quality cannot be engineered, pre-thought or injected by advertising. Marque comes from a one minded clear original thought forced into existence when nothing preceded It to show the way. Men wore their mark on their cars and their cars were named after them. It wasn't about a balance sheet. It was about a pursuit of perfection. Charles Rolls and Frederick Royce, Louis, Marcel and Fernand Renault, Andre-Gustave Citroen, Karl Benz, Gottlieb Dalmler who named his cars after the beautiful Mercedes his French distributors' daughter, Alfa Romeo (Nicolo Romeo), Enzo Ferrari, Ettore Bugatti, brothers "Carlo, Bindo, Alfieri, Mario, Ettore, Ernesto "Maserati, William Owen Bentley, Louis Chevrolet, E.L. Cord. Ferdinand Porsche and many more long forgotten in popular parlance. Margues - these are the innovators the pure inspiration and perspiration that ushered in the 20th

Standing head and shoulders above all these great men is one who not only innovated a whole science but inspired his workers who loved him like no other industrialist of the epoch. There are those who will dispute this for they only revere their cars for certain attributes. Look at any of these makes and you will find Vincenzo Lancia's inspiration permeating them.



Innovations and developments from Lancia's ideas have a distilled purity like unitary construction. independent front suspension, V type engines including the world's first V6, transmission tunnels, sub frames incorporating alloy suspension towers from the 1950/60's that were rejuvenated by Porsche three decades later. Surely a testament to Lancia's original thought. His use of innovative developments by other companies. Nothing was off the table. The first car to use radial ply tyres as standard. Front wheel brakes - Trikappas from 1919 were recalled to install front brakes free of charge. 4 wheel disc brakes from 1959 as standard, 4 wheel drive for road cars.

Not only did he bring to life memorable and distinct cars and design but also he was a pioneer of industrial relations and mentoring of his contemporaries. The likes of Webber, Carello, Pinintarina all owe a debt to Vincenzo. He helped his workers with housing, female work opportunity, physical education and the facilities for employees use.

His products were sought out by discerning and wealthy customers. The Famous Italian author and war hero D'Annunzio, Greta Garbo, Brigette Bardot, The Aga Khan, Juan Manuel Fangio (when he was driving for other marques), Mike Hawthorn, Stirling Moss,

of French comic book

Count Biscaretti di Ruffia 'founder of the Biscaretti Auto Museum, Turin' was given the task of

designing the Lancia Marque (badge) which still exists today.

It is telling that the only F1 car designed by Lancia won the 1956 F1 World Championship. Ferrari had been given the cars after Ascari was killed and Lancia fell on hard times but the greater majority of wins were in the most original cars. Enzo had all the cars destroyed after their use was final. I would hazard a guess he was "not amused" at the Lancia success when his own designs were at best ordinary. Nothing of the period other than the Lancia D50 could compete with the silver arrows of Fangio and Moss.

The Montecarlo Turbo was a Group 5 racer. Fielded by Lancia it won the FIA 1979 World Championship for Makes, 1980 World Championship for Makes and 1981 World Endurance Championship for Makes.

In rallying they have won the World rally Championship more than any other marque. (10 times, with Citroen the nearest at 8).

Lancia, a name not well known in Australia but alas it will probably become extinct because of poor management by the FIAT group who have owned the marque since 1969, If you have a chance to drive a real Lancia, you will probably be surprised at how good these cars are even in modern company.

The Mercedes-Benz Club of Queensland (Inc) was founded in Brisbane in 1971 by two European ex-patriots, Hans Salterod, a Norwegian and Wolf Grodd, a German.

Hans was a Brisbane commercial photographer and Wolf a graphic designer with his own advertising business. Their mutual interest in cars from the world's oldest car maker and combined professional talents resulted in a club which grew rapidly in numbers.

even though the marque in those days only had a meagre presence in Australia. Sadly, the club's first president, Hans Salterod, died only a few years after its formation, but Wolf Grodd went on to establish one of the country's most renowned classic car restoration businesses, 'Sleeping Beauties' in Brisbane. Wolf (pictured) remains an honorary member of the club today and is regularly seen at club events, always promoting his 'favourite car maker'.

From the inaugural meeting in a Brisbane park where seven enthusiasts arrived (including one who arrived on a push-bike), the club now boasts a membership of almost six hundred, but in many ways it is a far cry from the

> 'hands on' tinkerers whose passion for helping each other carry out repairs and restorations of those early days was the reason for membership. Now, there is a nationwide network of Mercedes-Benz dealers and the choice of models on the Australian market is spread across more than thirty different

vehicle types.

The Mercedes-Benz Club of Queensland is a member of the affiliated M-B Classic Car Clubs International, managed and sponsored by the parent company in Germany, Daimler AG. The clubs operate within a set of strict rules and guidelines under the banner of the MBCCCI, promoting the brand and its historical values in concert with the principles of its founders, Karl Benz and Gottleib

Daimler, the inventors of the motor car.

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Aussie Grand Prix Southport - Queensland 1954

The Date 7th November 1954, the place Southport Queensland., the event The Australian Grand Prix. I have looked carefully at the record but I can find no convincing reason as to why the Grand prix was held at Southport more than half a century ago.

It's an enigma but it is one thing that Gold Coasters can claim as "History". This sleepy little seaside dairy farming, timber getting and beach side town really was asleep at that time. The roar of engines and smell of Castrol R must have been like Martians landing.

Here a really poor road was converted into a race circuit. One can still travel the circuit if you know where to go. Starting near TSS you can drive along Benowa Road to Ashmore Road. Take a left turn along Ashmore Road all the way to Bundall Road and another left to return to the Benowa Road intersection. Considering they are "Roads" it must have been a real road circuit. There is scant evidence to suggest that along the Ashmore Road stretch at the then creek crossing was a small bridge which boasted a speed limit. Hard to believe a speed limit existed during a race but apparently it was dangerous. It is unlikely but one should never let the truth get in the way of a good yarn.

They were all present. Soon to be crowned World F1 champion 'Black' lack Brabham who spent his last year's less than 2 kilometers from the Olympic

Dunlop tiens Paradice. **nection** found hard to shake. Surfers Paradise Corner turn. Stan Jones, Lex Davidson,

"Gelignite" Jack Murray, Doug Whiteford etc. This was Australian racing royalty. They all fell by the wayside with mechanical convulsions or the veritable "bingle" (Stan Jones) with the exception of that wily Lex Davidson. First past the chequered flag for him. (first of a record breaking 4 wins in AGP)

This was the beginning of a love affair with racing the Gold Coast has International Motor Circuit had its time in the sun and then was thrown out like dirty laundry to make way for yet another housing development by a foreign investor. We thought "That's it we're done for," but no hot on its heels comes Indy and now V8s. Even the "retired from lifers" who try to expel the event haven't been able to succeed.

No passing

It seems you can take the motor racing circuit out of the Gold Coast but you can't take the Gold Coast out of Motor racing.

Let's enjoy the ride including the aroma of hot engines, the cacophony and the excitement as long as we can. Pretty soon we may have to watch the "yellow land submarines" race.

Ron Grosse

An early pioneer of motor sport on the Gold Coast

After both Ron and Kay Grose from Victoria won the Australian Go Kart Championships in Sydney in 1960, Ron then packed up his family (3 kids under the age of 5) and moved to London, England to be one of the very first Australians to follow their dreams in motor racing overseas.

Ron purchased one of the very first Mini Cooper S's ever produced and raced at Brands Hatch and Silverstone before returning home to Victoria 18 months later. He soon became one of the very best touring car drivers within Australia in the golden age of racing with such greats as Beechy, McKeon, Manton, Jane and Geoghegan. He went on to win the Australian Hill Climb Championships and the Victorian Touring Car Championship.



At one point during a hill climb in Victoria Alan Jones similar car broke down and Ron being friendly with Alan's father Stan Jones, leant his prized Cooper S to Alan Jones who went on to win the event from Ron. Alan also drove Ron's Go Kart prior to him leaving for England.

Alan went on to win the World Formula 1 Championship in 1980.

Eventually Ron & Kay had had enough of the Victorian weather and again they moved the entire family (now 4 kids) north to the Gald Coast. Ron soon became aware that there was a speedway track not far from his house in Rio Vista and again he put the helmet on to race FJ's at the track owned by the dairy farmers, the Rudd brothers.

Keith William's Surfers Paradise International Raceway soon opened and Ron then raced at the circuit in his Ford Anglia Sports Sedan, fitted with a 302 Cobra V8 engine and also at the newly formed speedway on the inside of the track. He won Speedweek in 1970 and also went on to win the Queensland Saloon Car Championship and the Surfers Paradise 400.



Three generations of racing

Ron then moved onto driving and training trotters at both the Gold Coast Paceway and Brisbane's Albion Park and again he was quickly in the Winner's Circle, averaging at least one win per week and winning some major events. At one stage Ron trained up to eight horses and still operated his very successful real estate agency, Ron Grose Real Estate at Mermaid Beach.

in 1983 both Ron and his youngest son David raced in the James Hardie 1000 Group C Touring Car Classic at Bathurst and although a blown engine caused a very early demise, David returned the following year for a top 20 finish. The father son combination made history at Bathurst being one of only six father son combinations to race in the same car at the coveted event with such greats as Brabhams, Johnsons, Setons and Richards.

Ron, now a father of five, finished his racing career in the ever popular Gemini Series raced at Surfers Paradise and Lakeside.

Ron's son David went on to win the Queensland Speedcar Championship and his granddoughter Brittney, David's daughter went on to win the Brisbane Cup in Modiltes.




Ron retired on the Gold Coast in the late eighties and passed away in 2003.



I have been involved in motor cars since the early 60's when I purchased my first Holden, immediately modifying it with twin carbs, extractors and wide wheels.

I progressed with GM and bought, modified and sold various Holden's of the 60's vintage. In the early70's, I purchased my first 30's Chev and completely stripped it to bare rails and replaced it with late suspension, rack and pinion and rebuilt myself a 283 V8 that I completed only days before I was married which was used for my honeymoon from Tasmania to Brisbane and back to Adelaide. My first hot rod! I joined my first Rod Club in Adelaide and then moving to Brisbane I was one of the inaugural

members of the Northern District Rodders. In the 80's, I was curtailed by a growing family and school fees. I still followed rodding and enjoyed drag racing.

As we moved into the new millennium, I was in a position to purchase a '38 Buick then a '63 Chev then a '93 Camaro. I also bought a '67 Camaro that I used for drag racing and still own at the time of writing. The car has 468 cu in with race prepped Hughs transmission and 9" rear with Strange gears etc. The car runs high 9 sec at 134 mph for the quarter & stops with a parachute, great fun. Yes, I have owned and driven new BMWs and a new WM Caprice for towing my drag car, but

the enjoyment of driving them is only good for a couple of months then when you see hundreds of them on the road, it's time to change.

As I am getting older, my passion is changing and next in line is a '89 Bentley Turbo that I am sure will be 'updated' to my standard. I am sorry to the purists, but I like to be able to put my own personality into any car I own, as that to me is the joy of the hobby. 


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
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
